Contraceptives

Contraceptives are used as a recreational method of sexual intercourse without the worry of procreation.



Protection

Protection is undertaken in order to not have a baby, but to have sexual intercourse as a recreational method.



Copulation

Copulation is another word used for sexual intercourse, and is when a man and woman attempt to reproduce.



Condoms

The most common form of contraception for men, a condom fits over the penis and literally acts like a barrier, to contain the sperm ejaculated.



Pill/Combined Pill

The most common form of birth control, the pill or combined pill is taken by the woman and works for three weeks at a time; when it stops, a period is started.



Cap

A device that looks like a cap, it sits inside the vagina and stops the semen moving through to the cervix.



Diaphragm

Similar to a cup, the diaphragm also sits in the vagina to stop the sperm entering the cervix.



21 Days

Every 21 days, a woman will have a period. This is what happens during the menstrual cycle.



Implant

An implant is put into the arm of a female in order to stop pregnancy. It releases progesterone into the body.



Injection

Women can have an injection every 13 weeks to stop pregnancy from happening.



Patch

A patch that releases a hormone and works in similar fashion to the pill.



Coil

A t-shaped device that is placed in the vagina that stops the semen going further into the cervix. It can be copper or plastic.



Vaginal Ring

A contraceptive that is simply a ring that stops semen progressing through to the cervix. It sits in the vagina.



Tubal Ligation

The tying of the fallopian tubes so a woman cannot have a baby. This procedure cannot be reversed.



Vasectomy

A procedure that men can have to stop the flow of semen to stop having babies. It can be reversed if required.



Semen

Semen is stored in the testes of a male, and is mixed with seminal fluid when ejaculated.



Ejaculate

Ejaculate is a mixture of semen and seminal fluid that is ejaculated during intercourse and upon climax.



Sperm

Small reproductive cells that hold DNA genetic code of the male that is ejaculated during sexual intercourse.



Vagina

The opening and first part of the organ where a penis penetrates to have sexual intercourse in a woman.
